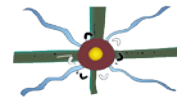

## WORLD AIDS DAY AND AIDS AWARENESS WEEK 2019 GRANT APPLICATION INFORMATION

The WA AIDS Council is facilitating a limited number of small grants, up to \$615 (plus GST), for health promotion officers, public and community health nurses, Aboriginal health workers and other relevant providers in regional/remote WA to conduct events/projects during AIDS Awareness Week or World AIDS Day.

Grant funding cannot be for internal salaries and wages. However, it can be used to host community information events, to create resources such as videos and brochures, for events with an HIV-positive speaker, venue hire, prizes, advertising, etc.

### APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible to apply for the grant, the following criteria must be met:

- Your organisation is based in regional/remote Western Australia,
- Your event/project is held during AIDS Awareness Week, **25 November - 30 November 2019**, or World AIDS Day, **1 December 2019**,
- Your event/project is aimed at the WA community (not for staff information sessions etc.),
- You are willing to complete and submit a summary report (template to be provided) and an acquittal of funding, received by **Friday, 19 December 2019**
- Your event must meet at least two objectives of World AIDS Day and AIDS Awareness Week:
  - to increase awareness and knowledge of HIV,
  - to dispel myths around HIV,
  - to promote safer sex and safer injecting practices,
  - to promote HIV/STI testing and treatment,
  - to ensure that people living with HIV can participate fully in the community, free from stigma and discrimination.

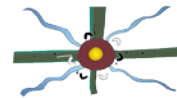


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## GRANT APPROVAL PROCESS

Each application will be considered based on its merits concerning the following points:

- Evidence that the applicant and proposed project/event meets the eligibility criteria (listed above),
- Evidence that the proposed project/event meets the objectives of World AIDS Day and AIDS Awareness Week,
- Evidence of how the proposed project/event will benefit the community,
- The overall appeal and suitability of the proposed project/event.

Please note that a limited number of grants are available, up to a maximum value of \$615 (plus GST) (\$676.50 inc. GST) per grant.

In the event of a high number of applications meeting the criteria, the WA AIDS Council reserves the right to offer reduced funding amounts to allow more grants to be awarded.
